National Honor Society

The Petosega Chapter of the National Honor Society was established in 1925, and since that time has initiated to membership one hundred and twenty students. Miss Beebe is faculty advisor.

Only fifteen per cent of a class is eligible for membership, five per cent chosen during the Junior year and ten per cent in the Senior year. This fifteen per cent is selected from the twenty-five per cent students highest in scholarship. They are picked by the faculty and the society members on a basis of scholarship, leadership, character and service.

During the year 33-34 eleven new members were chosen, seven from the Senior class and four from the Junior class.
